Use of Cut Throat Razors in the Hairdressing Industry

Environmental Health Guide

Cut Throat Razors



Cut-throat razors with a non-changeable blade are not permitted for use in any commercial hairdressing establishment in Western

Australia due to the risk of spreading blood borne viruses such as hepatitis B and HIV/AIDS.

Microorganisms and minute quantities of blood and bodily fluids which are not visible to the naked eye may be present on the razor after use. Simply washing and disinfecting the blade will not destroy these organisms and will place other clients at risk of infection if the blade is reused.

Cut throat razors with disposable **single use** blades are permitted. A new blade must be used on each client, and the detachable blade must be disposed of into a sharps container (as per Australian Standards) after each use. The blade handle must be cleaned with warm water and detergent to remove any contaminates prior to a new single use blade being attached.

Disposable Razors

Disposable razors must be **single use** and disposed of into a sharps container after each use.

Where razors blades have a detachable blade, the blade must be disposed of into a sharps container (as per Australian Standards) after each use. The blade handle must be cleaned with warm water and detergent to remove any contaminates prior to a new single use blade being attached.
