Child Health Library (CHL)

The Child Health Library provides information on child health to consumers, their families and carers, health professionals and the general public of Western Australia.

CHL is a free service based at Princess Margaret Hospital.

We Provide:

- Accurate and up-to-date information in response to requests received
- Information in easy-to-read (non-medical) language
- A confidential and personal service
- Improved access to information for health consumers, particularly those disadvantaged by reason of disability, language or distance

Our Staff:

Librarians are available to help you obtain the information you need. Staff do not give medical or counselling advice, but can provide contact details for relevant health agencies and support services as required.

Main Subjects:

- child health conditions (eg. asthma, cancer, ADHD, epilepsy, diabetes)

- child disabilities, genetic conditions (eg. Down syndrome, spina bifida, autism, deafness)
- coping with illness and hospitalisation
- child and adolescent health and nutrition
- growth and development, child safety
- child and teenage parenting, family life
- mental health and wellbeing

- Lending library of books, DVDs and videos
- Extensive range of free health pamphlets
- Information in a variety of languages where available
- Electronic resources, including public Internet access for health information
- Details of health services, community groups, self-help and support groups in Western Australia
